The idea to put up a family register of the Peter and Maria Nickel family is not an impulse of the moment. Years back my father suggested that I should take interest in preparing a family tree. He recorded many of the names and dates in a book and after his death in 1945, my mother continued adding data. I am, therefore, greatly indebted to my dear parents, J.A. and Annie Kroeker for much of the information in this family register. In 1959, when I first began this work, my mother did most of the corresponding for me. After she passed away in 1961, my efforts were temporarily stalled until 1964, when I resumed the work.

Since the John D. Nickel family and the Peter Unger family have a complete register, I have not started with Jacob Nickel, father of Peter Nickel, but have confined myself more or less to the Peter and Maria Nickel family, bringing in only so much as to give you the names of their parents and relatives.

In this family register, I have followed the pattern used by my father, but have added the code system. An earnest endeavor has been made to have accurate and correct data. However, should errors have crept in, I am sure you will bear with me.

On the whole, I have enjoyed putting up this register, although the work was very time consuming. It gives me great pleasure to present it to you, not as a finished product, but rather as a tree that will need attention. Please watch for new branches and twigs and mark down the dates.

At this time I would like to express my deep personal appreciation for the encouraging words along the way, e.g. "Wishing you lots of success," - "Keep up the good work," - "I wish you success in this project." - "Es freut mich, dass Du Dir so viel Muehe machst um alles aufzuschreiben von der grossen Nickel Familie" and others.

I am indebted to Mrs. P.L. Nickels Inman, Kansas, Mrs. Is. Buhler, Winkler, the late Mr. Isaac Schroeder, Herbert, Mr. John Thiessen, Clearbrook, Mrs. Frank H. Brown, Herbert, and Mrs. H. Isaac, Wpg., who have supplied me with much of the information of their respective families.

A word of thanks and appreciation go to Mrs. Jacob P. Nickel and Mary of Clearbrook, B.C., and to the Henry Quirings of Hepburn, who have assisted me again and again; yes, I thank all of you, whose interest, help and co-operation have made this work possible. Special thanks go to the representatives of the 11 families for their valuable contributions.

I trust you will find reading this register a delight also because of the neat and accurate work done by Miss Irene Hiebert, who has typed and multigraphed the material.

You will understand when I say that my beloved husband was an extra encouragement to me, especially in the last stages of this work.

With all of you, I thank God for allowing us to share in the lives recorded in these pages. May the verse in Proverbs become more meaningful to us. "Children's children are the crown of old men; and the glory of children are their fathers," Prov.17:6.

Peter Nickel was born May 10, 1854 Nieder-Chortitzza, South Russia. His parents Jacob Nickel & Justina nee Driediger, had 8 children, 4 sons and 4 daughters, and Peter was the second youngest. When he was 8 years old, his parents moved to Borsenkowo on a farm and there he spent his youth.

At the age of 22, on October 10, 1876, Peter married Maria Wiebe, born October 12, 1857, daughter of Dietrich Wiebe and Helena nee Friesen from Michaelsburg, Fuerstenland, S. Russia. There were five children in the family, Maria being the second youngest.

Peter and Maria Nickel lived with their parents, the Dietrich Wiebes for one year and then bought a farm in Pluoff. However, after two years they went back to Fuerstenland on a farm in the village of Alexanderthal. There were four villages close together - Alexanderthal, Georgsthal, Rosenbach and Olgafeld. Michaelsburg was about 12 miles away near the Dnepr River. On the other side of the river were Nieder-Chortitzza, Pluoff and the city of Nikopol.

In 1883, both Peter and Maria Nickel came to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ and were baptized upon their faith by Rev. Peter Weufeld and were received into the M.B. Church. In 1893 Peter Nickel was ordained to the ministry. He loved the Word of God and spent much time in reading it and committed favorite portions to memory. Many hours were spent in making house visitations. He also served as choir director for several years, supported by his wife Maria and their children who sang in the choir.

Peter and Maria's marriage was blessed with 12 children, all born in Russia, except the youngest, who was born in Manitoba and died at birth. Peter Nickel wanted his children to get an education. I remember my mother telling us how he had promised her 100 Rubel (Russian money) if she would attend school the seventh year. (At that time children usually attended 6 years.)

During these years in Russia, they experienced the protecting hand of God on many occasions. One spring they had a flood and their son Peter fell off the plank that was laid over the flowing stream. In a miraculous way Peter was rescued by his teacher, Mr. Abram Enns.

At another time mother Nickel went to the store in Olgafeld with her daughters Nettie and Annie. As they crossed a fast flowing stream, Nettie fell off the plank into the water. Mother Nickel saw her come up, grabbed her hand and pulled her out of the water. This incident gives us a glimpse into the character of Maria Nickel. It is here that she portrayed a presence of mind in a dangerous situation, accompanied by quick and resolute action.

In 1901 their son Peter migrated to Manitoba, Canada, and in 1902 the Peter Nickel family followed. They arrived in Winkler, Man. on April 15. The older children worked on farms helping to earn a living for the large growing family.

The following year, 1903, Peter and Maria Nickel moved to Springfield, Sask. (now Laird) on a farm near the east bank of the N. Saskatchewan River. They lived in a 2-room house for 6 years. It was truly a pioneer life. During this time Mary, Jacob, Peter, Annie and Justina married and moved to farms in the vicinity of Langham, Dalmeny and Aberdeen, except Annie, who moved to Winkler, Man. Helena had married in Russia and she and her husband also went on a farm in Sask.

Peter Nickel loved to fish and he had ample opportunity to do so in the river near by. His daughter Annie made him a net, which he put up in the river. He had the honour of landing probably the largest fish in Saskatchewan waters. This happened not only once, but many times. To his great delight, he would come home with a 5 foot long sturgeon hanging over his shoulder. This magnificent fish supplied them with meat for the winter. Happily they went about preparing it for immediate use as well as for conservation. Children and friends were invited for Fischbraten (fried fish).

In 1909 the Peter Nickels moved to a farm near Hepburn, Sask., where they lived 8 years. The five other children, Tina, Neta, Elizabeth, Margaret and Dietrich married during this time. Elizabeth also moved to Winkler, Man. In 1917 when Dietrich took over the farm, Peter and Maria Nickel retired and built a small house in Hepburn, Sask.

After a long and busy life on the farm and with their family, they felt like taking it easy. However, "God's ways are not our ways." On January 15, 1919 Maria Nickel has a stroke which affected her nervous system and she became almost helpless. The family celebrated their golden wedding anniversary on October 10, 1926, and all children were present at the occasion. Two years later mother Nickel had a third stroke and on Dec. 18, 1928 she died at the age of 71 years, having shared joy and sorrow with Peter Nickel for 52 years.

Throughout these years she had been his faithful and constant companion, helping him in providing for the family as well as giving him her ceaseless support in his ministry to the church, especially in having an open house for the entertaining of countless visitors. Mrs. Jacob P. Nickel writes that they lived with the parents for one year and it was then that she learned to love and appreciate mother Nickel. She was diligent, thrifty, good-natured, devout and always friendly, though firm when it had to be. She had a happy disposition and loved to sing. When the children were all married she would play the organ and father Nickel would join her in singing. During the time of her illness, she was comforted by many a song and the Word of God.

On June 13, 1929, father Nickel married Maria's sister, Mrs. Helena Redekopp nee Wiebe from Herbert, Sask. Her eight children were married. She brought sunshine back into the life of Peter Nickel and they lived together happily for 13 years and 10 months. She too had a happy disposition and it was a joy to visit them in their home. When she died on April 4, 1943, father Nickel was very lonesome.

How he appreciated the visits he received! His eyes would sparkle when he would tell about the wonderful truths and promises he had found in his Bible. One of his favorite passages was John 14, where it speaks of the heavenly home, and another was Rev. 20, concerning the New Jerusalem. Such passages he could recite from memory. He was a man of faith and his prayers were full of content and meaning.

Although Peter Nickel had a very strong constitution, ailments set in during his last five years. His blood pressure was high, then liver trouble set in and his strength began to fail. During his last three weeks he suffered greatly. However, he was cheered by the visits of his children from far and near. His end was drawing near and on Thursday, Sept. 25, 1945, in the morning, he quietly passed on to be with his Lord, whom he had loved and served. He had reached the age of 91 years, 4 months and 15 days.

Jacob and Suzanna Nickel

We were privileged to have God-fearing parents who loved the Lord and were deeply concerned about the physical and spiritual welfare of their family. Though they had six children, yet each one was granted Bible School training, for which we all were indeed grateful.

It was on November 29, 1903, when our parents, Jacob and Suzanna Nickel, united in marriage and established their own home. They pioneered on a homestead near Langham, Sask., where together they built a house 14 x 18 from poplar trees which father chopped down. With a hand saw and a few other tools they erected the frame, plastered it inside and out with mud. The roof was laid with sods. For paint they used white-wash, inside and outside, and the house was ready. Ten acres of land were ploughed with a pair of oxen.

Our parents had great faith in God and trusted Him for help in all circumstances and therefore experienced many an answer to prayer. One day a prairie fire, driven by a strong wind, swept across a large area towards their place. Marvelously God undertook. The huge fire mess divided into two strips and roared past on either side. During the night, however, the wind changed directions and the fire came back directly towards them. In faith they called to God for help and He answered. Though the stars shone, moisture began to fall and the fire was quenched when just half a mile away from them.

In 1910 they moved to Dalmeny with three little girls on a farm with a fine house. Church and school were not too far away. However there were only 36 acres of cultivated land. Again father had to work hard to clear bushland, but he had an extra measure of

courage, ambition and good health. The Lord blessed their labor and their home. Three sons and a daughter were born to them on that place. One son, about 2½ years old, died in 1918 after a serious illness. Parents nursed him in the home till he passed away. Their submission to the will of God made a lasting impression upon us.

In 1947 they moved to Clearbrook, BC. and settled down to retire. They were privileged to celebrate their diamond wedding anniversary in 1963, a highlight of God's grace in their lives. Dad was not too well at the time. On March 10th his doctor said that there was no help for him. As always in his life, father was completely resigned to God's will and said, "If God calls me, I must go." He was a man of great faith and prayer. His close fellowship with the Lord was keenly sensed by the family. He wanted to stay for mother's sake, but shortly before his passing, he told us that the Lord had revealed to him that He would not restore him to health, but would call him home. In a slow but steady tone, he made his last wishes known. He voiced his concern for our dear mother (who is very hard of hearing - a cross to bear). In a way we had never heard before, he entrusted her to God and into the care of the children. His last concern was the spiritual welfare of children and grandchildren. Two days before his passing, he raised his right hand, pointed upwards with his finger and gently waved his left hand. On August 20, 1964 he quietly slipped away to be with the Lord at the age of 87 years. Mother and two daughters faithfully nursed him in the home to the end. He is now waiting for all of us in Glory.

Father was a peace-loving, humble and thankful man, patient with all men, ever ready to forgive, even before being asked. He served the Dalmeny MB Church for 22 years as secretary-treasurer. Both father and mother served faithfully as S.S. teachers for a number of years. Our dear mother is still with us at the age of 82. Our parents have demonstrated courage, endurance, hope, love and hospitality to us. They received many guests into their home with an ever warm welcome. We, the children, thank the Lord for His leading in the lives of our parents. They have been a blessing to us and others.

Isaac B. and Helena Enns, my foster parents, were married in Russia in 1902 and came to Canada with my mother's family the same year. After working on a farm in Manitoba for about a year, they settled on a homestead in Saskatchewan, 10 miles from Langham.

My parents were a very hard working, deeply religious, happy, frugal couple, whose entertainment was church on Sundays and a visit now and then to relatives or neighbors.

Soon a small community of Mennonites were living to the north and west of us. This community was called Neu-Hoffnung or New Hope. Our preacher and large family had come by oxen team and had settled 3 miles from us. He later donated land for the Church to be built on. In 1917 it was decided that a church should be built. It must have been in the fall, as I was 2½ years old then. How do I remember? Well, I had one misfortune of falling into a well. I was playing with a cat, which ran away from me and I followed her straight over the well. The cat got over, but I didn't. Dad was away helping to build the church, so mother called a neighbor, a Mr. Frank Penner, (no relation) who incidentally had one of the first Ford cars around here. He came right over, lowered a ladder tied to a tree and hauled me out of nine feet of water in which I had been floating on pieces of rotten wood. I saw my rescuer again in 1960 in Saskatoon. Well, anyhow, the church was completed and I remember my teachers and many happy times in Sunday School. Our minister, Mr. Peters, had one of the first large threshing outfits in the district and because the huge steam engine was a Rumley, Mr. Peters was soon known all over the country as "Rumley Peters".

Our farm was quite bushy. One end was absolutely useless because of alkaline, which must have caused many hardships. Most of the expenses were paid with the money derived from the sale of butter, eggs and chickens. We kept either 4 or 5 cows, around 100 chicken and four horses.

I remember some bad bush and prairie fires and one in particular, that came too close for comfort. Everyone was out fighting that one and had it not been for a change of wind direction, our farm would have been wiped out.

Saskatoon was 18 miles away and this was where we took our butter and eggs every two weeks, summer and winter. In the latter this was quite a trip with horses and sleigh. We had regular customers in homes, as the stores paid far less. Once all was sold, we went shopping and I usually managed to get candy of some description.

At such times mother was left alone with all the work. It was in winter, while carrying water from the well to the cattle in the barn, that she fell on her knees and permanently damaged her one knee cap. I remember it being sore and swollen for months, the only remedy being liniment - no doctor. She never walked properly after that. Lifting big pails of slop for the pigs is what caused her rupture. It was this bad rupture which turned cancerous, that

caused her early death at 52 in 1931. When she finally went to the doctor in Saskatoon in 1929, it was already too late. In 1931, knowing that mother had only a few more months to live, my parents advised me to go back to my own mother, who had left word with the agency at the time of my adoption, that if I ever needed her, she would be notified. In August I left my foster parents and home and went to my mother in Hamilton, Ontario.

My foster mother died in October, two months after I had gone. She was always a woman of love and concern. She wanted so to see me grow up and have a family. I saw my father again in 1938 and he had remarried. I believe he died while I was serving overseas with the C.W.A.C. They were wonderful parents to me, nursing me first through the early months of my life, when nothing would agree with me except barley water., then later through measles, mumps and chicken pox.

I am deeply grateful for all they have done for me.

"There is a word, of grief the sounding token;
There is a word bejewelled with bright tears,
The saddest word fond lips have ever spoken,
A little word that breaks the chain of years;
Its utterance must ever bring emotion,
The memories it crystals cannot die."

The above excerpt well refers to the familiar "goodbye", which we like much better in the German "Auf Wiedersehn". The following is a brief summary of just a few happy memories "crystalled" out of the lives of our dear parents as we have known them.

In 1904 there was a young curly-haired lady residing in the community of Dalmeny, Sask. Her name was Katherine Lepp. She sang in the choir of the MB Church. In the congregation of that same church sat a young man, Peter P. Nickel, who was attracted by the lovely soprano voice. Romance was kindled and a wedding day was arranged for July 31, 1904. The two moved to Aberdeen where they homesteaded. That same fall father bought two horses and a plow. Oxen required too much patience. The house was a two-roomed building and all was in pioneer style. In pursuit of better land (and more opportunities) the young couple left to start a new home two miles from Dalmeny. Then a daughter was born. Susie was very dear to them. Her budding talent was revealed in the way she could narrate Bible stories at an early age. After a while another daughter named Mary entered the picture. Mary was very thoughtful. As soon as she could follow her parents at their daily task of milking the cows, she would stand at a safe spot, but equi-distant from father and mother lest she neglect one of them while she was entertaining with questions. However deep sorrow came when Susie died of Scarlet fever at only five years of age. A son was born. He was Peter, the first son in the family. One day he met his uncle Henry and was eager to break the news. "I have a Schwesterchen," he said. When asked about the name he poetically remarked "na Esterchen." Ruben, a curly-headed chubby little boy soon came on the scene. This boy still loves to sing and play the organ. One day, as if a thunderbolt from the clear sky prompted us, we children were all rushed to the John Buhlers for the night. When morning came it was announced that Rose Anne had arrived. She was a charming little girl who always could "bered her Sach". So there was the family.

Father and Mother Nickel were industrious. During threshing days mother could make waffles for 20 men, take care of her small children and tend to her chores. Her courage was indeed pronounced when harvesting was still done in shifts. She could deliver a frisky four-horse team to the field, then return with a set of tired ones, only to have them ready after four hours again. In 1939 a dairy was begun. The delivery truck picked up the fluid milk at 7:30 am. By this time all the milk was ready in cans, cooled to the right temperature. This meant rising at the early hour of 4:30.

Interests in our home were not all utilitarian but aesthetic as well. Though they both read much they found time for music and singing. Both of them played the piano and organ. Once a week

through the winter there was glee club practice at our house to accomodate Mary who was their accompanist. These families brought their families with them on horse drawn sleighs. Our house would ring with song and laughter, then calm down. There was lunch for all.

Education for all the children was their prime objective. Father had wanted to become a teacher, but there was no opportunity to study. Mother's ambition was to be a registered nurse. Circumstances never permitted this. Their only realization was: The girls became nurses, the boys are both teachers.

Seventeen years of relaxed retirement were spent in Winkler. Here they were able to celebrate their golden wedding anniversary October 10, 1954. Father reached the high age of 81 years and mother lived to be 84. They have shared their joys and sorrows and have gone to be with the Lord where there are pleasures for ever more.

As a family we take pleasure to pay tribute to our dear parents Jacob A. and Annie Kroeker, for we thank the Lord upon every remembrance of them. After their marriage on Oct.22,1905 they have always lived in Winkler.

If we should choose a motto or a key-word for the life of our parents, it would be the word "Service." "Serving the Lord with all humility of mind." Acts 20:19. They served God in serving man - the church, the community and their children.

Their Service to the Church. Having experienced the wonderful love of God, our parents were desirous to present their lives a living sacrifice. They took a keen interest in the church and conference. For 36 years father led the M.B. Church choir. He served as a S.S. teacher and helped to organize the youth work. He had a vision for a new church and donated the lots on which the church now stands. Mother supported him in every way. Her hands were always busy, and at the age of 71 she spent hours and hours painting in the church.

Father was one of the six men regarded as the founders of the Winkler Bible School in 1925 and has supported it whole-heartedly. As a promoter of the Winnipeg City Mission he served for 25 years.

Their Service to the Community. Our father general classified himself as a Notary Public and Merchant. As Notary, he did almost all the work done today by lawyers. In this field he was able to help many people and this gave him great satisfaction. On his desk was a glassed in motto, "For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?" Mark 9:36. This motto often gave him opportunity to speak to people on eternal values. During the time of the exodus to Mexico, he assisted people with all kinds of correspondence. Following this, came the influx of new immigrants from Russia 1925-28. Hundreds of families came through Winkler. Father met almost every train, greeted the newcomers and helped them to buy farms or find jobs. He brought many to our home and mother showed her hospitality to individuals and families for days and weeks.

For more than 20 years, father served on the Winkler School Board. He was on the first Board of Directors for the Bethel Hospital in 1936 and as a representative of the Child Welfare, he helped many mothers and children.

Their Service to their Children. Cicero has said, "What gift has Providence bestowed on man, that is so dear to him as his children." Our parents regarded their 8 children, 4 sons and 4 daughters, as a gift from God. They have given their all on our behalf. We marvel at their love, patience and understanding. Home was a place where we felt accepted. We remember their encouraging words, their timely advice, their wise counsel, their earnest prayers and their songs of praise. They loved to sing and have left us with a song. In the morning father would usually call us to the breakfast table by singing, "Hallelujah, schoener Morgen." Then we would have Bible reading and prayer. Our parents have helped in the moulding

of our personalities and were a living example to us by their faith in God and submission to His will. This was shown in a special way when our dear father took ill. He expressed his faith and confidence in the grace of God - "Gnade muss es sein, Gnade ganz allein." And when sickness came in mother's life, the verse given to them at their wedding, "Rejoice in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing instant in prayer." Rom.12:12 found application. She never grumbled, but patiently endured until the end.

In 1930 our parents were able to celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary. 15 years later father was called home and after another 15 years, mother joined him in glory. They have finished their course and have handed the Torch to us, to hold it high. May we not fail, but be found faithful in serving God, wherever He has placed us.

Justina Nickel Heppner, our dear mother, was born Feb. 9, 1887 in Russia in the village of Alexandertal. In 1902 the Nickel family emigrated to Canada and settled in Winkler, Man. A year later they moved to a farm in Sask., west of Laird. Here mother was converted, and shortly thereafter baptized by Rev. Jacob Wiens to become a member of the MB Church.

Our father, Peter H. Heppner, was born Apr. 20, 1885 in Morden, Man. In 1894 he moved to Sask. with his parents, where they settled on a homestead near Laird. At the age of 20 father accepted the Lord as his personal Saviour through the ministry of Rev. H. S. Voth. He was baptized and joined the MB Church.

It was here in Sask. that our parents met. They were married on June 20, 1907 and settled on a homestead near Langham. Four years later they moved to a farm 4 miles south west of Hepburn, where they endured many hardships in those early pioneering years. Here they also enjoyed 32 years of happy married life. Their marriage was blessed with three children, one son and two daughters. Our parents were not only concerned about material things, but also about their family's spiritual welfare.

Father was very fond of outdoor life, like fishing, hunting and fruit growing. He was also very fond of children and won their hearts at first sight. The grandchildren brought a special joy and delight into the lives of our parents.

For many years father practiced as a chiropractor. In this way he was able to help people in the community and in the surrounding districts. This gave him great satisfaction. It was this desire and ability to help, coupled with their warm personalities, that gave our parents a host of friends.

In December of 1942, father took sick with neuritis in his right shoulder. On Mar. 31, 1943 he died of a heart attack.

This left mother very lonely and she decided to move to Hepburn. She had always enjoyed good health. However, a few years after father's death ailments began to set in. She underwent a gallbladder operation in 1949. In the spring of 1956 mother noticed an ailment which the doctor diagnosed as lung cancer. When she was told that she could not be helped, she submitted herself to the will of God. As she grew weaker, she expressed her desire in the words, "I would rather die and be with the Lord." On Sep. 5, 1956 she passed away in the Waldheim hospital.

It was something new to leave a thriving business and to move together with wife and three children from Canada to California. Materialistically, it was sheer folly. Basically our parents had caught a vision of the need for intensive religious instruction, and in faith they set out to acquire Biblical training at the Bible Institute of Los Angeles. The fact that apple boxes would have to substitute for furniture and that their comforts would be few, did not dampen their enthusiasm. This willingness to do what they understood to be God's leading, even in the face of opposition, has always been characteristic of our parents.

Ever since we met our folks, we have loved them. Our love for them increased as we learned to know them better.

Just before the depression of the 1930's, we moved to the farm. Our parents realized that we were far from being little angels. There was much evidence that the wings we were sprouting were not only grey, but black. Work would counteract this in part.

Papa was very imaginative. Any menial task could become both challenging and interesting under his direction. Of course, this was his salvation, for with nine healthy, active children, with fertile minds, his life would have been a virtual nightmare had he not had the ability to utilize this energy. He taught us to know the delights of tiredness and the pride of accomplishment.

We had a happy home. Family singing, music-making, and devotions were a part of our life. There was also much fun and laughter. The rule, to do all things well, was also applied toward amusements. In summer they cleared the woods to make an attractive park and picnic grounds, entertained friends (with families), and took us swimming and boating. In winter, icy toboggan slides were built. Exciting "Crack the Whip" sleigh rides were great favorites. In the house, mother would often close her eyes to the fact that we were reading when we should be working, and we loved her for it.

Friends were always welcome. Mother's true selflessness in trying to please others and to make them happy has often been a source of inspiration to us. Missionary friends also found their way into our heart and home. The stories and experiences they related, provided enjoyment as well as food for thought.

Much more could be said about our parents and their service in the home, Bible School, church and community. But space does not permit.

They are older now than when we first met them, yet their concern for us is just as real. Their thoughts are still those of loving service. Their imaginativeness still finds way of bringing joy into the hearts of others. Their desire is to serve God to the best of their ability.

Our parents, John and Margaret Nickel Kasper, were married Sep. 17, 1916 in Hepburn, Sask.. For the first six months they lived with dad's parents, and then moved to a farm nine miles from Waldheim. Their possessions consisted of four horses, one cow, a few chickens and very little furniture. The implements consisted of a drill, plow and harrow. Money was scarce and the crops were consistently poor.

Dad was an ardent big game hunter and an excellent sport fisherman. He enjoyed fishing even after his health failed.

It was on this farm that all their eight children were born: Clara, Elmer, Harry, Edna, Peter, Esther, Rosella and Clifford. On Oct. 2, 1925 Edna died of diphtheria at the age of 3 years and five months. The rest of the children were given preventative injections just after Edna became ill.

All the youngsters helped in working the farm. At the age of seven Harry lost his thumb when he got it caught in a horse halter.

In 1937 Clara left the farm to find work in Manitoba and in 1939 Elmer, the oldest son, enlisted in the Canadian Army and went overseas first the first Division. He spent all the war years in England, Italy and Sicily.

In spring of 1940 we left the farm and went east. In 1942 Peter also went overseas with the Canadian Tank Corps. Both boys returned home safely after the war.

In 1949 mom and dad moved to New Westminster where dad worked in a lumber mill. He had his first stroke while working there.

A hard experience came Nov. 4, 1959, when Elmer died suddenly of a subarachnoid hemorrhage. He left a family of 4 young children.

In March 1960 the parents retired to their first new home in Chilliwack. The first year they lived a fairly active life; but dad had another stroke and later that year suffered an embolism. After surgery he recovered sufficiently to come home for a while, but his activities were very limited. Sunday morning, Apr. 15, 1962, dad passed away. He was laid to rest in Valley View Memorial Gardens, Surrey, BC.

Mother is still enjoying good health and lives in Chilliwack. She attends the Alliance Tabernacle and is a member of the Ladies Prayer Band.

Our parents, Dietrich and Nettie Harder Nickel, were married Sep. 17, 1916, in Hepburn, Sask. They took over Grandpa Nickel's farm and grandparents moved to Hepburn and retired.

While living on this farm, our parents were blessed with 9 children. The first child, a daughter Florence, died at birth. Then there were 8 boys, one after another. A family of sons. Our parents gave Canada 8 sons - Herbert, Walter, Clarence, Arthur, Milton, Wilfred, Peter and Frank. Arthur died when he was not even 2 months old.

The farm brings back many memories. I remember harvest time and butchering time. Did we love those smoked home-made sausages with onions! Winter time provided a lot of enjoyment - tunnelling in the snow banks in the garden, skiing, skating, sliding and horseback riding.

Then there was always the joy of visiting Grandma and Grandpa Nickel. It was fun to raid their gooseberry bushes and plum trees. In fall we helped to bring the wood into their basement, which was to be used in winter. Maybe we would receive 5 cents to spend on candy. There was always a treat waiting at the close of a job.

After World War II broke out in 1939, six of the boys were willing to serve their country and two gave their lives in doing so.

Herby, the oldest, who had married, left for England in July 1939. He was killed in the Dieppe Raid in northern France in August, 1942. The Canadian troops had numbered 5000 when they left the coast of England. In seven hours of fighting on a hostile shore, more than two-thirds of that number had become casualties. In order to imagine what Herby must have gone through, one need but read Ch. 43 in History of World War II. He never saw his son Stanley. Five weeks after he was married, Stanley, who is in the army, went to Egypt for a year. He returned to Kingston, Ont. in November 1965.

Walter and Wilfred were overseas for five years. They served their apprenticeships as bricklayers after the war and have been busy laying bricks ever since. They are both married and live in Everett, Washington.

Clarence, the third son, was killed in England in 1942. Milton has been in the navy for 23 years. He and his family have lived in Edmonton, Vancouver, and are now stationed at Port Arthur, Ont. his final posting, after which he wants to retire. During the times that he has been on board ships he has visited Hawaii, Peru, Panama, Mexico, Major Parts on the Pacific Coast, England, Ireland, Scotland and the Azores.

Peter Louis left home at a very early age (14 yrs.) and has travelled extensively since that time. He joined the army when he was 16, and went to Greenock, Scotland on the Queen Elizabeth. He was in the contingent of troops that invaded Sicily July 10, 1943. From there they moved into central Italy, on to the Adriatic and to Ortona, Italy. In Feb. 1946 he finally got back home to Canada. He and his family live in Toronto.

Frank Franklin, the youngest son, lives in Richmond, BC. with his family, where he owns and operates the Nickel's Cartage.

We have much to thank God for. I'm sure I say this for our whole family.
